REPORT ON PASTORAL MINISTRY

[Fr P.S. Antony and Thomas Kuravanveliyel write about their pastoral experience in this issue of Kerala Tidings. Ed.]

My Experience of Pastoral Ministry in Chemboor

I am very grateful to the Lord for enabling me to complete a year of meaningful pastoral ministry after my ordination. I was privileged to serve under the able guidance of Fr Reji Kunnathethe in the Parish of Christ the King, Chemboor, in the diocese of Neyyattinkara. I was fully involved in all the six Churches, administering Sacraments and being available to the people. My Academic background helped me to organize many programmes and take

classes for various groups in the diocese. I was moved by the plight of the poorest of the poor and was able to understand their socio-economic and cultural situation. The various family problems, though disturbing at the personal level, made me pray intensely for them. It was an enriching year for me specially in this Year of Priests.

My Experience of Pastoral Ministry at Kiliyanthara

My heart overflows with joy and gratitude to the Lord when I look back after a year of parish ministry at St Mary's Church Kiliyanthara, one of the vibrant parishes of Tellicherry Archdiocese. I was there as Assistant Parish Priest for 364 days, i.e. from 15 January 2009 to 14 January 2010. It was a year of grace for me. Celebration of the Holy Mass with the people and the administration of the Sacraments helped me to know Him and to love Him more intimately.

I realized the value of my Jesuit formation. I could reach out spontaneously to the people, especially the sick, the elderly, the lonely, the children and the youth. With deep sentiments of gratitude I remember and thank the parish community who loved me as a dear member of their family. Their love and affection towards me was a constant reminder of their commitment to the Lord and His Church. Some way or other I communicated to them that I cared for them. I also insisted that being a Catholic does not mean to be ritualistic but being compassionate and just.
