ATMAMITRA, KALADY

Atmamitra, the newly launched teenage ministry of the province, is slowly expanding, by reaching out

to all Catholic Schools in the neighbourhood. Thank you **Frs Henry and Dolichan** who worked towards realizing this. There is a basketball coaching programme going on at our centre in the evenings for boys and girls under the able guidance of a lady coach, who is one of Atmamitra Animators. Senior boys do come also to the centre regularly for a game of Badminton. This academic year eight of the nine Catholic Schools in Kalady-Kanjoor-Thannippuzha area are already covered through orientation programmes. Atmamitra is slowly making a breakthrough entry to the two SNDP Schools in the vicinity. The number of students calling up Atmamitra over the phone or through e-mail for guidance on various topics is on the rise. There are also a number of students and youth turning up at the centre seeking personal guidance. The Second Saturday programmes have become a regular feature at the centre. By October, we may be able to host training programmes of longer duration for teachers and youth animators. At present **Fr Toby**, the new Director, is making the Centre known to schools and colleges and youth groups across Kerala finding time also to meet Catholic boys separately to boost Vocation Promotion. A total of more than 4000 students and about 400 teachers and 1000 parents have been covered under the programme so far. Our own educational institutions in Kozhikode, Kanjirappally and Wayanad have already made use of the services of Atmamitra. Contacts are established with the Kanjoor Forane KCYM, CML, Ernakulam Region of DCL and Christeen. About 30 of our students in collaboration with Chengal Residents' Association took up a plastic removal drive from the CRA area. The drive was covered by the local TV channels, Clear Vision and EC TV.

AICUF CENTRE, TRIVANDRUM

AICUF State Election Camp was held at Loyola College, Trivandrum from 13 – 15 July 2012. **Frs Joye James, Ranjith, Aneesh, and Jose Pulinthanath**, as well as **Mr Joy Thomas, Mr Sebastian Britto and Ms Chinju**, were the main resource persons who guided the election camp. The camp was inaugurated by Fr Joye James. 50 AICUFers from eight zones participated in the camp. The presence of six advisors and animators from different zones added to the effectiveness of the camp. **Mr Prince** from Bharat Matha College, Kochi, and **Mr Immanuel** from Christ College, Irinjalakuda, were elected as the State President and Secretary of AICUF Kerala respectively. A 'Janakiya Niyama Sabha' was organized by NAPM (National Alliance of People's Movement) at VJT Hall on 14 & 15 July 2012. Its aim was to submit a memorandum to the Government, seeking a 'just and sustainable development.' It wasn't actually raising a voice against the Government, rather inviting its attention towards socio-cultural and environmental problems faced by farmers, dalits, tribals, fishermen, marginalized and other vulnerable communities in Kerala. The felt need of such an assembly springs from the constant negligence of all political parties and other power-centres on issues warranting immediate attention. **Smt Medha Patkar, Sri Madenesh Bai, Sri C.R.Neela Kantan, Sri Jeo Jose**, Smt Sugatha Kumari, Sri T.Peter and other renowned social activists and environmentalists gave leadership to this peoples' assembly. The participants were mainly from 60 organizations in Kerala who are constantly seeking justice on humanitarian and ecological issues. AICUF was an active partner in this noble initiative. It was an opportunity for the Kerala AICUF to express our solidarity and support to NAPM and all those initiatives which strive to protect humanitarian and ecological rights. The presence of ten of our AICUFers and two animators on the first day and 40 of its members and other advisors on the second day were the manifestation of such solidarity. There was an opportunity for the AICUFers to interact with **Smt Medha Patkar** in the evening of 15 July, which was really an enriching and thought provoking session for our

students. These important dignitaries stayed in AICUF House, which was indeed a blessing to the Centre. They expressed their deep appreciation for the hospitality that they received here. 
GIAN WORKSHOP, MADRID, SPAIN

I was one of the participants in the workshop of the Global Ignatian Advocacy Network (GIAN) on the *right to quality education* organized by SJES, Rome. It was held at COLEGIO MAYOR LOYOLA, Madrid,

Spain from 16th to 20th July 2012. There were 9 Jesuits representing 5 Assistancies and 13 lay collaborators. The aim of the workshop was to find the possibility of building bridges between formal and non-formal education sectors of the Society of Jesus. We have prepared a position paper on *the Right to Quality Education* and the Action Plan to work it out at local and global level.
