PROVINCE ASSEMBLY- 2012

As announced, the Heritage Seminar took place on 12-13 May. It was joyous and gratifying that over a hundred brethren participated in the Seminar with enthusiasm and eagerness. Jesuit history in Kerala, starting with St Francis Xavier to the present, was dealt with in four presentations. **Fr Kottukapally** covered the period 1542 to 1773; **Fr Joe Pulickal** presented the period of Society's suppression and restoration; **Fr Sunny Jose** dealt with the restored Society in Kerala down to 1955 when the Kerala Region was established; and

Fr K.J.Thomas surveyed the development of the Kerala Province. **Dr Scaria Zacharia**, in his scholarly style, enlightened us on the Synod of Diamper, while a Syro-Malabar view of the Synod was presented as a short response by **Dr Jacob Koothur** of Thamarassery diocese. All the presentations were very well received, in spite of inevitable limitations. It is hoped that the papers will be duly edited and published as a special number of the Kerala Jesuit and will eventually contribute to the preparation of a History of Jesuits in Kerala. Hearty congratulations to the members of the Heritage Commission who organized this seminar. In the morning session on 14 Fr Provincial shared his views, concerns and plans for the Province with the Assembly. The Golden Jubilee of our 9 jubilarians was celebrated with a solemn Mass in the Christuraja Parish followed by sumptuous dinner. Fr Provincial presided over the Eucharistic celebration and **Fr Tom Panikulam** preached the homily. **Fr Joe Mathew** felicitated the jubilarians during the dinner in Christ Hall.

CONGREGATION OF PROCURATORS -2012

The 70th Congregation of the Procurators will commence on 29 June 2012 in Nairobi with an 8-day retreat for all the delegates. The Congregation proper will be held from 9-16 July 2012. Delegates from 84 Provinces of the Society of Jesus along with Fr General and his Counselors will gather in Karen in Nairobi and will deliberate on the agenda of the Congregation. THE SOCIETY OF JESUS IN NUMBERS

The new statistics of the Society of Jesus as of December 31, 2011 have been published. We give here a summary of the most important data.

The Statistics of the Society are based on the statistics of the Provinces and the Independent

Regions. We have 84 provinces, 5 Independent Regions and 10 Dependent Regions.

As of 1 January 2012, the total number of Jesuits was 17,637: 12,526 priests, 1,470 brothers, 2,896 scholastics, and 745 novices – a net loss of 296 members from 1 January 2011.

PRE-ORDINATION PROGRAMME (POP) - APRIL-MAY 2012

There at the Mount Sinai, the Lord appeared to Moses as a flame coming from the middle of a bush.(Exodus, 3:2)

Twenty 2nd year Theologians from the four South Indian Provinces were taken in a mini-bus from Beschi Illam, Dindigul to JMJ Retreat Center, Sirumalai on 17 evening, May 2012. The breath taking panorama unfolding before our very eyes as the bus traced its way up and the cool breeze caressing us were the foretaste of what was awaiting us on the mountain top. The Retreat center surrounded by coffee plants and the glazing canopy of the Silver Oaks and many other trees created a very pleasant atmosphere. To top it all, the "a/c – like" climate in Sirumalai was a welcome change from the heat and sweat of Pune, Delhi and Chennai. But the frequent power cuts and the absence of TV, Internet and newspaper and above all mobile tower put many of us off! But then we lifted up our spirits with the attitude of St. Paul: we can be equally happy in plenty and in poverty!

Fr Sunny Kunnappallil (KER) oriented us into the programme in the initial two days. He skillfully exposed the Letter of **Fr Arrupe** and the history of the programme and the present day challenges and opportunities of priesthood through sessions, group sharing and presentations.

Fr Frederick. B. D'Silva, (KAR) was with us for two days. His insightful reflections coupled with infinite experiences and memories as a Jesuit helped us to make some major splashes in the vast ocean of Ignatian mysticism and to cherish the uniqueness and privileges of Jesuit Priesthood.

Sr Selva, SCC is into the healing ministry for the last 18 years! She spent three days with us to help us in our psycho-sexual integration. Introducing the various stages of early child development she presented a number of insights into the why and how of our personality. She also dealt with certain important aspects of human sexuality and shed some light into the dynamics of interpersonal relationships, especially the one with the complementary sex. She was also available for those who wanted to get rid of some of their phobias using NLP and also for counseling.

The ever dynamic and inspiring **Jerry Rosario** (MDU) set the day ablaze with his insights on Jesuit Priesthood today. His personal sharing on how he approached his ordination and how he lives his Jesuit Priesthood today as a Pioneer, Prophet and Pilgrim was very challenging and inspiring. Antony Samy** (MDU) fresh from his Tertianship, was our guide during the day.

We had four days of Intensive Journal with **Fr. Xavier John Bosco** (AND). Those were truly days of self discovery, acceptance and growth into liberation. We were led to the awareness that our lives are unique masterpieces of God and there is an open invitation to be happy and to celebrate life. The openness and authenticity of Fr Bosco and his firm yet gentle attitude was learning in itself. **Fr Britto Vincent** (MDU) presented the letter of Fr General on intellectual apostolate and stressed the need for us

Jesuits to focus very specially and contribute in the field of Intellectual apostolate. **Mr Selvaraj**, an ex-Jesuit and currently an educationist, shared some of the important expectations of the lay people from Jesuits in the field of intellectual apostolate. She has been a close associate of Jesuits for a long time and teaches some core subjects in Arulkadal (Madurai RTC). Her sharing was indeed thought provoking and challenging. Her extensive knowledge of Jesuit spirituality and tradition helped her make her points well. The simple yet pious sharing of **Mr Maria Joseph**, a retired School Head Master was interesting. His deep faith in our Lord and respect for priesthood stimulated many of us.

Before the retreat began we had a day's personal sharing in which Fr Britto Peter, the organizer of this year'S POP was present. The sharing was beneficial to all. **Fr. George Joseph** (MDU) preached a very effective retreat for us to bring about a fitting finale to our Arrupe month. The retreat with a special view to the impending priestly ordination was greatly insightful and encouraged us into a fervent spiritual preparation.

NEWS FROM ROME

SJES: Annual Meeting of Conference Social Apostolate Coordinators. The annual meeting of the Conference /Assistancy Social Apostolate coordinators was held at the Curia in Rome, from May 14-18. This year the major area of discussion and reflection was on the responses of Jesuits to the Ecology document "Healing a Broken World" (*Promotio Justitiae*, n. 106/2011). These responses

were gathered from the Province Social apostolate delegates based on a questionnaire sent from the Secretariat. They revealed a clear picture of our response to the challenges of ecology and environment today both in the Provinces and Conferences. On the last day, the team shared on the state of *Global Ignatian Advocacy Network (GIAN)* in each of their conferences and the way forward. The members had also an interaction with Fr. General, who complimented them for their committed work and shared his concerns of the Society of Jesus especially in the area of ecology.
