FROM OUR INSTITUTIONS

CHRIST HALL, CALICUT

SAMEEKSHA AND ATMAMITRA, KALADY

Fr. Sebastian Painadath presented a paper on "Sharing Christ Experience in Encounter with Asian Spirituality" at the Pre-Synodal Bishops-Theologians Colloquium at Ishwani Kendra, Pune. He guided the annual retreat of all the priests of the Archdiocese of Yangon and gave there a seminar on Inter-religious Harmony. At the end of September a group of 30 spiritual seekers spent a weekend at Sameeksha reflecting on the scope of "a spiritual search within and beyond religions". A short Vipassana Meditation course was conducted at the Centre. Sameeksha community gave an affectionate farewell to **Fr Henry**. Over the years, he had been an inspiring presence here. **Fr George Nedungatt** is back with us for a while after his three months teaching commitment at Dharmaram Vidyakshethra. **Fr Martin Puthussery** is back with us after assisting our tribal centres in an exposure programme in Central India accompanying a group of 11 tribal youth from Kerala Jesuit tribal centres. **Atmamitra** has completed three of the proposed four residential programmes for the various Graduate batches of Amal Jyoti College of Engineering, Kanjirapally successfully. The overwhelming response of the students to the training programme has forced the management to invite us for the PG batches as well. We also gave Orientation Seminars to the final year UG and PG students (about 400 students) of Sacred Heart College, Thevara, around 900 students of all batches of St Xavier's Women's College, Aluva and around 500 first year students of Bharatha Matha College, Trikkakkara. Another highlight of the month of September was the training programme for YEAST (Youth Empowerment and Spiritual Training), a brainchild of KCYM, Palghat Diocese. The fact that **Fr Toby** is alone in most of these training programmes is made up for with his attempt to rope in Ex Jesuits and veteran CLC members to help out based on need. This experiment seems

to be working out well. Atmamitra is also planning to form a team of lay and religious persons to take its programmes of student and teacher training and student guidance ahead.

S.M FARM, PARIYARAM

The Samskriti started functioning in the beginning of September blessed by **Fr Jacob Kumminiyil** in the presence of S.M. Farm workers and Jesuits. The main work of the newly appointed staff of Samskriti is a research study on "Dalit organizational work, especially of Dalit Christians in North Malabar, against caste exploitation". The research has already started. There is a core team selected from the Advisory Council of Samskriti to help us regularly in the study.

Another work of Samskriti is training programmes of which the second one was organized in collaboration with ISI, Bangalore, from September 21-23 at IRC on the topic, "Electronic media, its impact on youth and its use for advocacy work". The participants of about 40 consisted of prominent lay leaders from Chirakal mission, youth, college students, teachers, counsellors and Sisters. The resourceful and serious group found the 3-day seminar extremely relevant and useful. The programme was inaugurated by **Fr Benny Manapatt**, Director, KAIROS, the social service organization of Kannur diocese. The resource persons included two lawyers from the law college, Thalassery, **Fr M.K. George**, Director, ISI, **Fr Sunil Padanamakkel**, Principal, ITC, Pariyaram, **Fr Sony Thomas** and **Fr Johnson Simethi** of Kannur diocese. As part of the 3-day seminar the participants visited the Payyannur Network Television Centre, and found it new and complementary. The channel took care to broadcast the visit and the seminar twice. The newspapers also gave good coverage of the programme which has made Samskriti quite known in the ecclesiastical and secular circles in this area.

Greetings from Yogyakarta, Indonesia! After a loving farewell at ICLA, I left at 5.00 a.m. on Sept. 15. Some took the trouble to wake up early and to wish me "Good-bye!" and "Come again." In Singapore, I celebrated Holy Mass in different Parishes: 3 times at our Church of St Ignatius where, citing the example of what Korean Lay People had done for the evangelization of their country, I appealed to the Lay People in this Year of Faith and in this Millennium of the Laity to volunteer and evangelize Mainland China. As St Francis of Assisi had said: "Preach the Gospel; if necessary, use words!" They were quite tickled that an Indian was making this appeal! In the Church of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary which is celebrating its 160 years of existence and which boasts of the largest number of Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life, I appealed for young and generous volunteers to serve Our Lord in mainland China. Plenty of Chinese boys and girls came to shake hands with me after the Mass. Let us pray that Our Lord will send healthy and zealous labourers into His Chinese Harvestfield! I also celebrated Mass twice at the Missionaries of Charity. I met my first cousin (a Ship Captain), my Montfort Schoolmate (a Brother of St Gabriel), a Loyola old Boy (Vinod Varghese is the nephew of our 3 Vattakunnel Brothers!), 2 Jesus Youth Leaders (Santhosh Joseph and Deepu Joseph, trained by our Abraham Pallivathukal), our fellow-Jesuits and many old friends. I landed here on the 28th afternoon. This, our Universitas Sanata Dharma, and opposite it the Catholic Lay People's Universitas Atma Jaya have 10,000 and 9,000 students respectively. We are just 5 kilometers from the airport. Actually Yogyakarta is the Oxford of Indonesia, having more Universities than you can imagine! Tomorrow, October 1, I will begin my English Classes even though our Superior-cum-Director and our 3 Myanmarese Juniors have been delayed because of Visa problems. We already have 4 East Timorese and 2 Indonesian Juniors here. Kindly pray for this new venture of the Jesuit Asia-Pacific Conference and for all of us here. Thanks! I am getting invitations from a number of our Province-men to join FACEBOOK. Sorry, neither do I have an account nor do I intend having one.

FROM CURIA, ROME

Fr General's Visit to Poland. From 23 to 30 September, Father General visited both Provinces of Poland. Two important anniversaries were the reason for this visit. 27 September is the fourth centenary of the death of Father Peter Skarga, a Jesuit who is very important in the story of Polish culture. 12 October will mark the centenary of the death of Father Jan Beyzym, a great missionary who dedicated his life to the care of lepers in Madagascar, and who was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 2002.

ECO-FRIENDLY ROOF FOR BOM JESUS BASILICA

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) is planning to provide an eco-friendly roof to Bom Jesus, Goa's oldest Basilica, a world heritage site, which houses the remains of St Francis Xavier. The massive asbestos roof on the imposing lateritic stone

building will be replaced by eco-friendly galvanized sheet. The decision was taken to ensure that tourists were not exposed to the risk of cancer due to exposure to asbestos, said Jesuit Father Savio Barreto, Rector of the Basilica. Built in 1604, the church attracts thousands of tourists and pilgrims every year. A few decades ago, heavy maintenance costs forced the authorities to switch from tiles and rafters to asbestos to cover the 300 sq mt wide roof of the church.

AFRICA: TEN YEARS OF AJJAN

The *African Jesuit AIDS Network* (AJAN) has just celebrated its tenth anniversary from its foundation. The network was set up by the Jesuit Superiors of Africa and Madagascar (JESAM) in 2002 to coordinate and expand the Jesuit response to the AIDS pandemic across the continent. Building on what has been achieved to plan for the future, AJAN has organised two workshops in last few months. The first launched a unique programme for HIV prevention, in the context of integral youth development. The second workshop has considered programmes in the wider context of the social injustice that causes AIDS, and has focused on a response that enhances the self-reliance and dignity of people.

BRAZIL: NEW JESUIT WEBSITE

In recent months the Brazilian Jesuits have launched a new website with a new logo. With this initiative the Society of Jesus wants to give more visibility to social, educational and cultural projects which have been undertaken since some time in the country. At the moment the Jesuits in Brazil are about 650, many of them involved in various charitable works. The educational network of the Society of Jesus counts about twenty schools including universities and institutes of higher learning, with about 150,000 students, plus more than 70 social and educational projects spread all over the country. HONG KONG: THE JESUITS AND THE FOUNDING OF A UNIVERSITY

The Jesuits in Hong Kong officially present the Hong Kong Special Administration the request for the establishment of their own University. According

to the *Kong Ko Bao* (the Chinese version of the diocesan bulletin), the Jesuits have centuries of experience in the field of education, appreciated also in China, especially in Hong Kong, where they have two high schools. In China, their commitment to education dates back to Fr Matteo Ricci (1552-1610). In recent history, the Jesuits founded in Shanghai the *Institute of Chinese Studies* in 1870 and the *Aurora University* in 1903: in Tian Jin, in 1922, the *Institute for Trade and Industry*. With the arrival of the first Irish Jesuits in Hong Kong in 1926, *Ricci Hall* was founded (a male accommodation within the University of Hong Kong) and two *Wah Yan College*. Precisely the alumni of Wah Yan launched the first proposal for the establishment of a Jesuit University in Hong Kong, appreciating the excellent education offered by the Jesuits

IRELAND: JESUIT AWARDED PRESTIGIOUS FRENCH HONOR

Conor Harper, an Irish Jesuit, has been awarded one of the most prestigious honors that the French government can bestow. He has been appointed as a *Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres*, one of the four ministerial orders of the French Republic. The purpose of this award is to honour individuals who have distinguished themselves through their artistic or literary contributions or the contribution they have made to the spread of French culture in France and worldwide. For over forty years Conor has promoted French culture in Ireland and abroad, teaching French to young Irish students during all that time. Since 1976 he has been chaplain to the French community in Dublin, an appointment made by the French Embassy and the Archbishop of Paris. He is also vice-president of *Alliance Française*, an organization whose aim is to promote French culture and serve as a place for intercultural exchanges between Irish culture and the cultures of the French-speaking world. He is regularly called on by French radio and television to do interviews concerning current Irish stories of interest abroad.
