We received systematic guidance and proper instructions from Fr Aerthayil to make the camp a success. It was indeed a great learning experience for the scholastics. We had the opportunity to give a Christian Life Orientation Camp for the students of the parish of Vynthala where Blessed **Euphrasiamma**, CMC, lived for some years. The parish priest and the religious sisters were welcoming and quite generous towards us.

OBITUARY

BR ABRAHAM MADATHIPARAMBIL, S.J. 04.04.1942-17.05.2013



Abraham Madathiparambil was born on 4 April 1942, to Mr M T Joseph and Mariam. Madathiparambil family is blessed with eleven children. It is doubly blessed, since, seven out of the eleven are religious and priests. Following the examples of

his elder brothers and a sister, Abraham joined the Society of Jesus on 15 June 1962. In addition to his religious formation he was trained in typing, book keeping and mechanics. He acquired expertise in administration and technical skills from Innsbruck, Germany. Br Abraham Madathiparambil served in various institutions in different capacities. His exceptionally long tenures as Principal of our two technical institutions, Pius X ITC, Edathua and Nirmala ITC, Pariyaram are worth mentioning. The

unique filing system introduced by Br Abraham is still followed in both our ITIs. The personal relationship Br Abraham maintained with his students, staff and their family members is praiseworthy and is worth emulating. He always attracted a band of friends around him. Br Abraham also kept up a very personal relationship with his fellow Jesuits. He was a good community man, and his love for the Society was wonderful. The well knit family background became impetus for his close bondage in the Society. The personal intimacy his companions experienced with him resulted probably from his family background. He always supported the working members in the community by extending his helping hand even for their personal needs. Br Abraham took personal interest to keep the house premises clean and he was never reluctant to do any menial job for the community. He always kept himself busy till the last active days in S M Farm by rearing chickens and cleaning kennel. Br Madathiparambil had always been a motherly presence in the house, a presence that radiated love and affection. He gave company to the one who was late for meals. His queries after a long day's work or a long tiring journey were always rejuvenating. His deep relationship with Jesus through his prayer life made him loving and lovable. His regularity in spiritual duties was exemplary. The fruits of his prayer life was clearly revealed in his way of "doing ordinary things in an extraordinary way". The ideals he lived for boosted the community and promoted individuals. Senior Jesuits enjoyed his companionship, and the Superiors were able to count on him. For the young ones he was an example and a model. Evidently Br Abraham's demise has created a vacuum and a sense of loss for the community. Grief has gripped us all, those who know him intimately and those who have ever met him. Br Abraham continues to inspire us through the memories of his exemplary Jesuit life and we can firmly believe that he intercedes for us in the heavenly court.
