Several lecture series were held at Heythrop to mark the 400 years of its foundation. **Dr Richard Leonard SJ** who directs the Australian Catholic Office for Film & Broadcasting, gave an enlightening talk on 'Where the Hell is God? Holding to Faith through the Tough Times'. A public lecture by Professor Sarah Coakley, Professor of Divinity, University of Cambridge, Fellow of Murray Edwards College on the theme 'Ecclesiastical Sex Crises: The Lack of a Theology of Desire' was held on 2 October. ## LEARNING FROM THE SUPPRESSION AND RESTORATION OF THE SOCIETY OF JESUS

### NO.4

#### The Role of St Peter Canisius

He was born in 1521 in Nijmegen in the Duchy of Guelders, which, until 1549, was part of the Habsburg and is now the Netherlands. He was sent to study at the University of Cologne, he earned a Master's degree in 1540, at the age of 19.<sup>[1]</sup> While there, he met Peter Faber, one of the First Companions of Saint Ignatius. Through him, Canisius became the first Dutchman to join the newly-founded *Society of Jesus* in 1543. Through his preaching and writings, Peter Canisius became one of the most influential Catholics of his time. He supervised the founding and maintenance of the first *German-speaking* Jesuit colleges, often with little resources at hand. Because of his frequent travels between the colleges, a tedious and dangerous occupation at the time, he became known as the Second Apostle of Germany. By the time he left Germany, the Society of Jesus in Germany had evolved from a small band of priests into a powerful tool of the *Catholic Reformation*. Canisius spent the last 20 years of his life in *Fribourg, Switzerland*, where he founded the Jesuit 'preparatory school', the *College of Saint Michael*, which trained generations of young men for careers and future university studies. Canisius lived during the height of the Protestant Reformation and dedicated much of his work to the clarification of the Catholic faith in light of the emergence of the new Protestant doctrines. His lasting contribution is his three catechisms, which he published in Latin and German, became widespread and popular in Catholic regions. In his fight with German Protestantism, he requested much more flexibility from Rome, arguing: If you treat them right, the Germans will give you everything. Many err in matters of faith, but without arrogance. They err the German way, mostly honest, but very open for everything Lutheran. An honest explanation of the faith would be much more effective than a

polemical attack against reformers. He rejected attacks against *John Calvin* and *Melanchton*: "With words like these, we don't cure patients, we make them incurable."

## Pope Francis: The scandal of hunger & the globalization of indifference



October 16th is **World Food Day** and in a message to the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization Pope Francis condemned the continuing scandal of hunger and malnutrition in today's world and what he called a globalization of indifference towards it.

Pope Francis's address was delivered by Monsignor Luigi Travaglini in a ceremony marking World Food Day at the Rome headquarters of the UN Food and Agriculture Organization. In his message the Pope criticized what he called "a growing tendency for us to close in on ourselves saying this leads to a certain indifference on both a personal, institutional and state level" towards hunger as though "it were an inevitable fact."

The Pope urged the international community to break down "the barriers of individualism and the slavery of profit at all cost," not just in human relations but also in the global economic and financial dynamics. In order to conquer hunger, he said, "we need to re-educate ourselves in the value and meaning of solidarity, an uncomfortable word that is often put to one side."

As he has done in the past, Pope Francis criticized the fact that around a third of all food produced in our planet goes to waste and said "we need to modify our life styles including our eating habits." "This waste of food," he continued, "is one of the results of our throw-away culture that often leads



to the sacrifice of men and women before the idols of profit and consumerism.”

The pope said this was “the sad sign of a globalization of indifference that is slowly making us get used to the suffering of others as though it were a normal thing.” He concluded his message by calling for an education in solidarity and a lifestyle that overcomes our throw-away culture and places human beings and their dignity in centre stage.
