SAMEEKSHA, ATMAMITRA AND JEEVIKA, KALADY

An international group of Irish Christian Brothers spent three days at Sameeksha as part of their ongoing formation. On 3 December about 100 socio-ecological activists came together to reflect on the Gadgil Report on the Western Ghats. After Christmas a study group from Germany took a four day course at Sameeksha on Indian Spirituality. The Annual Day of Sameeksha was celebrated with an inter-faith prayer and Christmas gathering on 24 December evening. On 13 December the community went out for a picnic: in the forenoon we were received by the family of Sebastian Painadath and in the afternoon we visited the places of Jesuit heritage at Sambaloor. Sebastian Painadath gave a research seminar on Inter-scriptural hermeneutics for M. Th students at St Peters', Bangalore. He also addressed a lay group of the Archdiocese on dialogue of religions.

Fr Xavier Tharamel participated in an International Seminar on Raimundo Panicker at New Delhi and presented a paper, on Aspects of Religious Pluralism.

Atmamitra organized first of its NLP workshops with a participation of 22 people from all over Kerala. **Fr AXJ Bosco** (AND) was the resource person. **Fr Toby** gave a seminar each for the parents of St Charles' School, Perumon and for the students

As part of the Career Guidance Centre, Samskriti

has started week-end classes for PSC competitive examinations. Classes were inaugurated at the end of November by **Fr Clarence Paliath**, the Principal of **St Joseph's College**, Pilathara, in the presence of Fr Jacob Jose, the Forane Vicar of Pilathara, members of the Advisory Council of Samskriti, representatives the Dalit Christian organization, students and teachers. Conducted in the campus of St Joseph's College, Pilathara, on Sundays from 2 to 5 p.m, the classes consist of daily and monthly tests, topical presentations and occasional talks on PSC examinations. Those who have completed +2 are eligible for the coaching classes. More than a dozen teachers from the parishes of this area are helping out in the classes. It is mainly meant for students of Dalit Christians from Chirakal mission. The Career Guidance Centre guides and motivates the students for higher education while the PSC coaching classes train them for employment after their studies. With an enthusiastic set of teachers, the classes are going on very well. The specialty of Christmas celebration of St Mary's parish, Pariyaram, under the pastorship of **Fr P.T. Augustine** was the 'Moving Crib' which was prepared by the youth of the parish. The singing youth-group in a mobile vehicle fitted with the crib visited the neighbouring parishes and the family groups in the parish.

FROM BANGALORE

"The blind see, the lame walk, ... and the deaf hear" (Mt 11:5). This applies to me for the year 2013. In September I had cataract operations in both the eyes at Narayana Netralaya Eye Hospital, Bangalore, rated the eighth best in India. With new glasses now I see better. In another clinic I had myself tested for my hearing. It was so weak that I could hardly hear the questions my students asked in the class. The doctor prescribed hearing aid and the technician got me Bernafon, Swissmake, reputedly the best in the world. When I saw the bill, I was shocked: Rs 70,000 for the left ear and 60,000 for the right. I had not quite heard the oral transaction! But now the deaf ears hear. Before Christmas I was called to hear some confessions. I went and sat down having forgotten the hearing aid. I could not hear what the penitents said. But I absolved, and God forgave (me, too). Finally the lame walk. Since my stroke in 2009, I needed a walking stick. Now I walk with the help of a pair. Yes, *a pair*. Father *Sebastian Painadath* got them for me from Germany in last March. At Sameeksha, I tested them to the curiosity of *Fr Samuel Rayan* and *Br Varkey Mampilly*, who were not, however, tempted at the sight of my sprint

or by the word of Fr Sebastian to procure them a pair. Called ergonomic sticks, they are light, made of carbon, strong but not stiff, and adjustable for length. They give you a sprint as you walk and help you speed up keeping your body straight without leaning on one side as is usual with the traditional walking stick. I had already a pair in Rome (gifted to me by a former student, who is now a bishop). After the 2009 stroke, I used to put them to good use for walks on the terrace of PIO. Before I left for India last year, I had packed them along with my other personal effects to be shipped later. And PIO had promised to have them shipped as cargo. But no unaccompanied baggage could be shipped according to Indian regulations. So they got dispersed in PIO, as my CMI friends were told later when I had them enquire about my personal effects. Fiat! But providence has provided for the lame to walk. And following the inspiring example of the Jesuit Pope Francis one can always learn to live with the minimum necessary.

RESTORATION OF THE SOCIETY

As we celebrate the bicentennial jubilee of the restoration of the Society, our thoughts naturally go to the history of the early Society and to the contribution it made to the universal Church and humanity in general. Above all, we want to know and experience the nature of the driving spirit that enabled the early Society to forge ahead against all obstacles and in the process produce so many heroes and saints. Many books have been written on these aspects. However there seems to be unanimity of opinion among authors that this spirit is enshrined in the Spiritual Exercises. And we know that the Spiritual Exercises made with the required prerequisites will transform men radically. And the early Society had a host of such deeply transformed men who served in an outstanding manner, the Church and the human society. Now-a-days also the Society possesses such men who underwent profound transformation through the Spiritual Exercises. A conspicuous example is Pope Francis himself. Biographies of Pope Francis point out a profound transformation in Bergoglio during the few years after he laid down his office as the Provincial of Argentina. And they attribute this change to his intense encounter with the Spiritual

Exercises. Commentators further point out that this assimilation of the Spiritual Exercises has given a conspicuous consistency to all his statements and actions. As for example, on the very recent Apostolic Exhortation, *Joy of the Gospel*, (*Evangelii Gaudium*) they have remarked that its inspiration is the Spiritual Exercise. After reading it and reflecting on it carefully, I would go a step further and say that its deeper structure is the Spiritual Exercises. Our Jubilee celebrations should lead us to such a profound assimilation of the spirit of Spiritual Exercises.

GOLDEN JUBILEE OF THE INDIAN SOCIAL INSTITUTE

The *Indian Social Institute* (ISI) has organized the final celebrations of its Golden Jubilee during the first week of December. A national seminar on the theme “Breaking New Paths for Inclusive Development” was organized on December 5 and 6 in Bangalore, while a religious celebration was held on the evening of December 6. The inaugural function of the seminar was presided over by **Fr. Edward Muduvassery**, Provincial of Jesuits, South Asia, and **Syeda Hameed**, member of Planning Commission, delivered the keynote address. About twenty scholarly papers were presented at the seminar on different topics, including development debate; labour and workforce development; gender and development; human rights and development; civil society and development activism; ecological concerns and management of natural resources; children and development. About 100 academicians and activists from across the country took part in the program.

INSURANCE FOR MIGRANTS

The *Xavier Institute of Management and Research*, (XIMR) in Mumbai has designed a unique financial solution to help migrant tribal people in Mumbai, India’s financial capital. The scheme, designed in collaboration with the *Chotanagpur Migrant Tribal Development Network* (CMTD) and Mumbai-based Jesuit social center *Seva Niketan*, is expected to help over 20,000 migrant tribal people

from Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Orissa and West Bengal live in Mumbai. “It is running a pilot project to encourage monthly savings, incentivizing them with medical and health insurance for their family members,” said press release from XIMR director, Father Paul Vaz S.J. The post-pilot ecosystem will consist of banks, insurance and healthcare companies.

PETER FABER IS A SAINT

Peter Faber has been declared a saint on 17 December 2014. Pope Francis has canonized one of the first companions of St. Ignatius extending his devotion to the universal Church. This is a so-called “equipollent” (equal in force) canonization in which the Pope, by his authority, extends the worship and liturgical celebration of a saint to the universal Church, after having fulfilled certain conditions established by Pope Benedict XIV (1675-1758). This practice was used by Pope Francis himself on October 9 for the canonization of Blessed Angela from Foligno and by his predecessors Benedict XVI, John Paul II, John XXIII, among others.

The canonization of Blessed Peter Faber holds a special meaning because he is a model of spirituality and priestly life of today’s Pope and at the same time an important reference to understand his style of government. Faber lived on the crest of an era when the unity of the Church was undermined and he remained essentially alien to doctrinal dispute, directing his apostolate to the reform of the Church and becoming a pioneer of ecumenism. How much his example is rooted in the pastoral horizon of Pope Francis is felt in the synthetic portrait he made in the interview he gave to *La Civiltà Cattolica*, revealing some essential aspects of his personality: “His dialogue with everybody, even the most remote and even with his opponents; his simple piety, a certain naïveté perhaps, his immediate availability, his careful interior discernment, the fact that he was a man capable of great and strong decisions but also of being so gentle and loving.”

The aspect of Faber is that of a contemplative in action, a man attracted to Christ, passionate about the cause of the brothers, experienced in discerning

the spirits, devoted to the priestly ministry with patience and mildness, offering himself without expecting any human reward. Faber meets God in all things and everywhere, even the most cold and hostile settings. In his *Memoriale*, which is one of the main documents of the spirituality of the early Society of Jesus, his life is conceived as a journey, a journey through the various regions of Europe following the example of Christ: traveling for obedience, always alert to make God's will and not his own.

Father Adolfo Nicolás, Superior General of the Society of Jesus, expresses these same aspects in a letter to the whole Society on the same day.
