

SATYA NILAYAM, CHENNAI

Yet another academic year commenced on 15 June with the Mass of the Holy Spirit presided over by **Fr S.J. Antonysamy**, Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore. Jithin, the sole representative of the Province in SN, rose to the occasion and got his juniorate companions into a singing mode. The Province group in Chennai

consisting of Prince and Stevenson who has come back to his alma mater for M.Sc. Maths along with Fr Jose Jacob was able to gather for a fellowship meal. Two days of orientation, a week of academic orientation, a well-planned Chennai darshan, the process of admission to the College, a day-out in the form of faith-sharing, the annual pilgrimage to St. Thomas Mount, etc. have been fruitfully planned and meticulously executed.

Fr C.J. Joseph came over here to teach Latin to the first year students. He explored the surroundings of SN with great enthusiasm. He has already completed a few rounds of cycling. He finds the place very conducive for cycling except that he has adjusted the timing to suit the weather and the schedule of class.

JESA, LOK MANCH KERALA

LOK MANCH activities have helped three of our organizations, AADI, TUDI and SNEHARAM to collaborate with three other social work organizations each in their respective geographical areas of work. After the national launching of the project, the first attempt was to conduct a baseline survey to assess briefly how each pocket (minimum 150 households of our priority community members) fares with regard to some of the indicators of development at the collective level like access to entitlements ('a rightful claim to a certain quality of life') like public drinking water facility, drainage facility, public toilets, community hall, primary health centre and approach road to a main road within a perimeter of one kilometer. At the individual household level, data collection was mainly on how entitlements envisaged in the National Food Security Act were already availed by the respondents.

Attappadi Unit was the first one to finish the survey. Fr James Morais took extra care to print and reach the schedules in time and supervise the data collection efforts. Organization-wise Cheru Resmi Centre was the first one in Kerala to finish the survey of all 20 pockets, namely, 3000 households and reach the schedules to ISI-Bangalore under the leadership of Sr Lily, I.C.M.

In the meanwhile, a Unit-level review meeting of Lok Manch was conducted in every unit, namely, Thiruvananthapuram, Attappadi and Wayanad, in the presence of the State Coordinator. The focus of the next two months' activities will be: 1) promotion of Lok Manch through public meetings and other materials like notices and posters; 2) identification and training of community leaders and monitoring committee members with input on various entitlements to be availed by the people through Lok Manch. Many meetings are planned at the pocket, organization, State, Zonal and national levels. A zonal level workshop on report writing on 16 July in Bangalore, a core team members' meeting in Bhopal on 11-13 August and Fr Sannybhai's visit on 5-12 September are the main Lok Manch meetings in the offing. JESA General Body Meeting will be conducted on 29 and 30 July 2016 at AADI, Attappadi.

While engaged in Lok Manch and JESA work, we have found the youth of our respective localities rather alienated from any socio-political and cultural involvements. To enlist the support of the youth of our locality we had planned leadership training programme in collaboration with ISI-B and other Lok Manch and JESA partners. Two of the training programmes were conducted by JESA and Lok Manch partners at Aicuf Centre, Thiruvananthapuram and S.R.C., Kozhikode. The former was mainly for the youth from fisherfolk communities and the latter for tribal youth of Wayanad. The camps planned in collaboration with JEEVIKA and AADI were postponed due to inconvenience of the participants. The socio-economic, political and cultural analysis in the camp made the youth ask themselves: "What can I do for my people?" They need to be followed up to actualize the action plans they have come up with at the end of the camp.
